

## The latest information on how Covid-19 is affecting travels to Germany.

The **Germany-wide measurements** to contain the Covid-19 Pandemic are effective until the 30<sup>th</sup> November:

- **Masks obligation** rules in e.g. public transports, stores, markets, city centers and further crowded spaces, where the **minimum distance of 1.5 meters** can't be maintained.
- **Personal contacts** must be reduced to a minimum therefore, the gatherings in public and in private are only allowed in groups out of **two households with less than 10 persons**.
- **Stores** which are larger than 10m<sup>2</sup> remain open, however, services which require draw near are closed.
- **Gastronomy** entities are closed, however, **take-away services** remain available.
- **Travels** are restricted by **touristic accommodation prohibitions**, also all leisure facilities e.g. museums, cinemas, gyms are closed.
- **Fines** may be imposed without prior warning in case of violation of the obligations.

## Travel relevant information when travelling

Since the 13<sup>th</sup> November, the RKI (the German equivalent to Folkhälsomyndigheten) considers Sweden as whole country as risk area. Deriving from that, mandatory **quarantine** applies for all travelers from Sweden to Germany.

Since the 2<sup>nd</sup> November, a prohibition for **touristic overnight accommodation** rules, however with an exception for overnight accommodation for mandatory business travels.

## Current quarantine regulations

Travelers who have stayed in a risk area within the last 10 days, have to register online prior entering Germany on the website of the [Bundesministerium für Gesundheit](#). Furthermore, it must be proceeded directly to the final destination, where self-isolate must be conducted for 10 days. - **Exception: transit**

The obligation to self-isolate at home does not apply in the case of transit through Germany. In this case, you are obliged to leave Germany **immediately**.

- **Exception: negative test result after 5 days**

Depending on the regulations of the Länder, the quarantine may end after **5 days** if a Corona test states a **negative test** result. In that case, the test results must be carried along for the next 5 days.
